

Influence of global crude salt supply on soda ash

Recently, Salt Partners were flying over Australian solar saltfields. The salt stockpiles were depleted. The Asia-Pacific chloralkali industry depends on solar salt from Australia and Mexico.

About a half of the world 40 million t/y of synthetic soda ash is being produced in China. The Chinese soda ash industry has been growing at a rate of 13% per annum. How does the shortage of Australian salt effect the international trade? How do the salt prices react? How will the rising salt prices effect the Chinese soda ash production economy? Can other countries fill the gap?
